Description: Whose Report Will You Believe - By Faith, I Will Believe the Report of the Lord. Just as Abraham's faith was imputed unto him as righteousness, I'm in covenant-

relationship with God! A child of inheritance to the promise.

Righteousness In Christ By Faith

Abrahamic Covenant: Genesis 12:1-3; 15:1-21; 17:1-14

- Circumcision All male descendants of Abraham, including:
- Abraham himself (at time of Command)
- His son Ishmael (At age 13)
- All male children born in his household or bought with money (servants/slaves) (Regardless of origin)
- All male descendants going forward at 8 days old

Description: God's promise to Abraham to make him a great nation, bless all nations through his seed, and give land to his descendants. This covenant is based on faith and is foundational to both Israel and the Church.

Genesis 17:9-14

Abraham, A Great Nation – is one of the central focuses of the Abrahamic Covenant, and it appears repeatedly in Scripture as part of God's unfolding redemptive plan

- Numerous Descendants God promised Abraham that his offspring would become as numerous as the stars (Gen. 15:5) and the dust of the earth (Gen. 13:16).
- A National Identity This "great nation" would have land (Canaan), a covenant relationship with God, and become known as Israel.
- Spiritual Legacy Through Abraham's seed (ultimately Christ), all nations would be blessed (Gen. 12:3; Gal. 3:16).
- Fulfilled in Israel and the Church Israel became the literal nation, and the Church—composed of Jews and Gentiles who share Abraham's faith—is part of the spiritual fulfillment (Gal. 3:7–9).

Abraham as the Father of Many Nations This expands the promise beyond Israel to include a multitude of nations, fulfilled both through his descendants (Isaac, Ishmael, Keturah's sons) and spiritually through Christ. • Genesis 17:4–5 (NRSV) 4 "As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. 5 No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations." New Testament Fulfillment – Abraham Spiritual Father to All Who Believe • Romans 4:16–17 (NRSV) "He is the father of all of us, as it is written, 'I have made you the father of many nations'—in the presence of the God in whom he believed" Paul uses this to teach that Abraham is the spiritual father of all who believe—both Jews |

It included the Law (Torah), setting Israel apart as God's holy nation. Blessings were contingent on obedience; disobedience brought curses. | | | New Testament Pentecost Event: Acts 2:1–4; Joel 2:28–32; Acts 2:16–21; Ezekiel 36:26–27 | Description: Pentecost marks the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. It fulfills Old Testament promises and begins the Church. The Holy Spirit gives believers power to share the gospel, brings them together as one body, and puts God's law in their hearts. |
